FROM THE EAST

Brethren,

The year 2020 has been genuinely interesting the pandemic, the lockdown, the quarantine, all make the anticipation of resuming, reconvening, and reoccupying our Lodge, an exciting proposition. Nevertheless, given the nature of uncertainty of the nation's present situation, we can only hope that we will finally meet again at our much-missed Masonic Lodge and continue our Masonic business, camaraderie, and fellowship on June 11, 2020. I expect another promulgation from the Grand lodge to confirm this notion.

Assuming that the Masonic Moratorium will be lifted and we will be granted to resume our Scheduled Stated Communication on June 11, we are going to spread the ballot on 5 people, 2 for restoration of rights and benefits and reinstatement of membership to our lodge, 2 for affiliation from another lodge to ours, and 1 to receive the mysteries of Masonry. It will be quite a long process should there be complications during the proceeding.

Meanwhile, we will continue to maintain our lodge the same way we have been doing for the last 2 months. Shout out to the Brethren who have been doing lodge maintenance on their own time. Wor. Jerry Anderson, Wor. Jim Wagner, Wor. Bob Rathbun, Wor. Brian Adams, Wor. David Conner Bro. Bruce Yorgey, Bro. Dave Schroy, Bro. Jim Witcher, and Bro. Tom Mirsky moved the chairs and tables, and stripped and applied new wax on the cafeteria and fover floor. Wor. Bob Rathbun and I repositioned the tables back after the wax had dried, and Wor. Jerry and Bro. Jim Witcher moved the chairs out of the Parker Room. Wor. Jerry painted the refrigerator doors, and Ms. Nancy cleaned the women's bathroom. Shout out also to Bro. Bob Schratweiser for continuing to work the yard. In addition, shout out to Bro. Dale Graham for wrestling, I mean replacing the water closet (commode) in the men's bathroom downstairs. Moreover, shout out to Wor. Tony Paramore and all others who participated in moving the (illegally) dumped dirt in the back of our lodge, I apologize for not mentioning your name(s) as I do not have a list of the participants in that effort at this time. As always, thanks to Ms. Lynn Wagner for her continuous support to get our *Taper* organized, and prepared for printing, and to all those who help fold the *Taper* for mailing. Finally, all honor to the 5 Brethren who braved the uncertainties which we are presently dealing with and volunteered to join me in the Masonic funeral service for Wor. Frank Leslie Rentz on April 30, 2020. Wor. Frank entered the celestial Lodge on April 29, 2020. His granddaughter moved heaven and earth to fulfill her grandfather's request to have a Masonic funeral. Due to the COVID 19 restrictions, the first Holloman Brown Funeral Parlor in Norfolk would not allow the Masonic funeral service, so she had to move Bro. Frank to another Holloman Brown at Great Neck Road, Virginia Beach. Since

only 10 people are allowed in the building, there were only 6 Masons; RW Jimmy Caton, Wor. Jim Wagner, Wor. Dave Conner, Wor. Bob Rathbun, Bro. Jim Witcher, and myself; 3 members of the family; and the Funeral Director. The ceremony was quick, I believe we spent less than an hour inside the funeral building including preparations. By the way, our Masonic funeral service is currently administered by two Brethren who are 65 years old and above.

Phase 1 of reopening our economy started last Friday. I believe the number of people allowed to congregate in Phase 1 is 10 also and restaurants are still maintaining 6 feet social distancing, which is good and safe. Phase 2 is scheduled for implementation on June 1st and the number of social congregations would be increased to 50. Phase 3 down the road will probably be restored back to normal i.e. what it was like before the lockdown. Assuming that these figures will be implemented, we will have to adjust our Masonic funeral service group commensurate to the extreme importance or seriousness of safety concerns. At present, there is no vaccine or cure to stop the virus. Brethren, according to the reports of our scientists, 65 years old and above are more susceptible for infection by the COVID 19. And, when we increased the number of people inside a funeral building to 50 and above, the probability of passing the virus to one another will increase proportionately. Therefore, there is a good possibility that we will not be able to get the 65 and above members to volunteer to perform the Masonic funeral service. Subsequently, I would like to call for younger members, 60 years old and below, to learn and get training to conduct the Masonic funeral service for our departed Brothers. If interested notify me, our Secretary Wor. Bob Rathbun, or Wor. Jim Wagner, so we can schedule your training. Again, given the gravity of the situation, THIS IS STRICTLY VOULUNTARY.

Our Secretary received 3 Parking Lot donations for the month of May from Bro. Bob Schratweiser, Wor. Dave Conner, and myself which makes our total collection very close to \$6,000. Thank you very much Brethren for your continued funding support in the face of adversity and changing times instigated by COVID19.
