So we will have a lot of items to cover at the Stated Communication. THE NEW COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS LIMIT FOR THE NUMBER OF PEOPLE ALLOWED IN THE LODGE IS 25. There are 11 Lodge Officers plus one Mason of the Year award recipient; therefore, we can only allow thirteen (13) Brethren on the sidelines for our December Stated Communication. The first thirteen (13) requests received by email, by person to person, or by phone will get to attend. I strongly suggest using email because our Secretary has a day job and cannot answer the phone while at work and phone answering services have been proven to be unreliable. We are still under the SAME COVID 19 RESTRICTIONS AND PROTOCOLS; YOU KNOW THE RULES.

The family of Wor. William Bernard Ramsey, who passed to the Celestial Lodge above on November 6, 2020, has announced that there will be a "Celebration of Life" where we will conduct a Masonic Rite of passage after the Pandemic is over.

I apologize for mentioning COVID 19 again, but it does not want to stay away from me/us. Every time I decide to say "finally, I do not have to mention it again to my Brothers, it shows up with a record-breaking spike. I guess I must accept the fact that I am destined to have this rendezvous with the COVID 19 for the whole year while I am the Worshipful Master of our Lodge. I hope that it does not penetrate through my body health defenses and to yours, Brethren.

There are two (2) MILESTONES that I am hoping to meet this year:

- To attain the goal of \$7,000/year for the Parking Lot Fund Drive. Brethren, we have met our target for this Milestone—to date, the total donation for the is \$7,890. This is placed in our Building Fund. We normally build this fund from dinners, breakfasts, special occasions like Fish Fry, etc. This account is what we use to fix what is broke (windows, parking lot, etc.) in our lodge. Brethren, we have excelled in this effort this year. Thank you very much.
- To maximize the Collection of our Annual Membership Dues before the end of December. Reason being is that we pay our annual bills, i.e. Building Insurance, Grand Lodge Assessments etc. from our Annual Dues Collections which are deposited in our General Fund. We are getting ready to write a check for our Building Insurance and a couple of months later, our Grand Lodge Assessment will be due, and the total of these two bills alone amounts to about \$9,000. Remember, there are other bills to pay in addition to these two like the utilities, admin and more. The point is, for those who have not submitted their Annual Membership Dues for 2018, 2019, and/or 2020, please do so as soon as possible so we can meet our obligations as in pay our Lodge's bills. As you can see, one cannot overemphasize the importance of getting this done.

As we approach the end of the year, I cannot help but ask the question, "Where did the time go?" I guess the obvious answer is "It was guzzled by the Pandemic along with the lifestyle that we used to enjoy." But then that would be too negative. So, looking at the positive side, the Pandemic tested our Fraternal strength and cohesiveness and we passed with flying colors. We displayed exemplary camaraderie and unity through the thick of things. During the lockdown, when everything was closed and our city seemed to be a ghost town, our fraternity was very much alive. Sure, we closed the building to non-members and limited the number of members permitted inside. The maximum numbers allowed in the lodge was enough to clean and sanitize it. Some of you stripped and waxed the floor, some painted the walls and appliances, and refurbished the paneling, and sprayed, wiped, the building with disinfectant. There were working parties for the ground areas outside, fixed storm damages, picked up illegally dumped tree debris, soil and many more. And then there is the Parking Lot project which we started in February. We paved the parking lot to make it safer for our members to tread on and then we started the fund drive. The fund drive got off to a good start in February and was going strong for a month and a half, then suddenly, in April, the LOCKDOWN WAS IMPLE-MENTED. The possibility of our objective to collect \$7000 for the year diminished due to the lockdown to mitigate the spread of the virus. As I mentioned above, we normally have fund raising dinners and other special occasions but they were shut down due to the COVID 19 lockdown. And, we ran out of ideas on how to reach our target for the year and just went on from one hope to another and kept the positive attitude that something might come up, and something did happen. Brethren, You happened! You came through for your lodge! You continued sending donations every month and this was during the time when our nation was under the grips of the Pandemic and our economy was spiraling down in geometric progression because of the shutdown. Donations continued every month until November where Wor. Jim Wagner donated to the Parking lot fund. Who knows, we might get another one this December. Brethren, we reached our goal for this year against all odds because of you, (you know who you are). And to those who could not participate due to their financial situation, thank you just the same for your well wishes and prayers for our Lodge, I am a believer of the power of positive attitude and prayer. FROM THE SOUTH

"And Zillah, she also bare Tubalcain, an instructor of ever artificer in brass and iron: and the sister of Tubalcain was Naamah."



Genesis 4:22 (KJV)

Artifice is a late Middle English/Anglo-French word meaning "trade, craft, or craftsmanship." An archaic word when used today, an artificer was a skilled or artistic worker or craftsman who we know today as goldsmiths, silversmiths, coppersmiths, and blacksmiths. But before any of these artificers ply their craft, they need the refined metal to work with.

Gold has long been considered one of our most precious metals, but it does not come out of the mine as such. To become truly valuable, it must first be refined. Refining is the process of removing all the other metals and impurities found in the raw ore leaving only the gold.

The refining of gold has been done since the 6th century BC and the basic process has changed little over the millennia. The metal is heated to the melting point, where impurities will separate into a layer on the surface of the molten metal and are repeatedly and carefully removed by the artificer until all that remains is purified gold. Gold karat weight is based on how much refining it has undergone: 24 karats=100% gold, 14 karats=58.5% gold, 10 karats=42% gold. The less the refining, the less precious it is.

Like the Entered Apprentice's common gavel, used to break off the corner of rough stones, the better to fit them for the builders use, the artificer takes an impure substance of little intrinsic worth and value refines it into a precious metal with which to the manipulate into something truly beautiful. A Master Artificer was once asked by his young Apprentice, "When do you know when you're finished refining?" The wise old Master replied, "I keep removing the impurities until I can see my reflection as if looking in a mirror." We are the Supreme Architect of the Universe's precious metal, and Masonry provides us the means for refining ourselves by removing the impurities of our lives to better reflect Him in our all our interactions with Mankind.
