I could see in their face they imagined their father giving Grand Honors just like they had seen us do just minutes earlier. FROM THE WEST

In honor of St. Patrick's Day, I thought I would share a little Masonic history from the Emerald Isle. The Grand Lodge of Ireland, A.F. & A.M., is the second most senior Grand Lodge in the world and the oldest in continuous existence. It gov-



erns 13 Provincial Grand Lodges covering all the Freemasons of the Republic of Ireland and 11 provinces worldwide. Irish Freemasonry boasts approximately 27,000 members around the globe.

In England, it was Irish Freemasons who set up a rival to the Moderns' Premier Grand Lodge of England, in the form of the Grand Lodge of England which we now call the Antients (or Ancients). The Grand Secretary of the Antients, Laurence Dermott, would author the Ahiman Rezon, or "a Help to a Brother", in 1756 based in part on Irishman Edward Spratt's 1751 work New Book of Constitutions. It was the Antients' ritual form that prevailed when the two rival English Grand Lodges joined in 1813. The Irish Constitutions became the foundation upon which our Constitutions of Masonry today are based.

The Irish Grand Lodge was the first to issue warrants as we know them to Lodges and, unlike the Grand Lodges of England and Scotland, had no problem in issuing warrants for travelling Lodges. As a result, the vast majority of Masonic Lodges in the British Army—wherever they came from—were warranted under the Irish Constitution. The form of Masonry that the British Army spread in the colonies was predominantly Irish. It was an English regiment with an Irish warrant that on March 6, 1775 initiated Prince Hall, along with fourteen other free black men, into Freemasonry.

Lodge Ireland 2000 is the only Internet Lodge under the authority of the Grand Lodge of Ireland. They meet physically four times a year in Ireland, and on the last Sunday of each month except December they 'chat' online. They do not confer degrees as only Master Masons may affiliate to the Lodge; they have affiliates from many Grand Lodges around the world. Visitors from any Grand Lodge in fraternal communication with the Grand Lodge of Ireland are always welcome to join their physical communications. The Grand Lodge of Ireland is in Regular Communication with the Grand Lodge of Virginia.
