Greetings Brethren.

This morning, I received the Communication from Most Worshipful Grand Master Douglas Vernon Jones that we have been looking forward to. The essence is that we can significantly relax the protocols we have been following for Stated Communications and other Masonic Functions. There are three significant exceptions, and those are that the word will continue to be taken up in the modified way, balloting will continue to have some extra safety considerations, and Degree work, due to close proximity, and personal touch, will continue to have some extra safety precautions.

Within those guidelines, we are free to resume Lodge activities, including meals, fundraisers, and events in a nearly normal manner. We will, of course be extra careful about cleanliness and sanitation, particularly among our food service personnel.


We will be having our June Stated Communication, 10 June, at the regular time, 7:00 pm, and, for the first time in a long time, we will be having our normal dinner at 6:00 pm. I look forward to a good attendance; however, if you believe that your circumstances require that you wait a little longer, take extra precautions, or keep extra distance, I certainly understand.

Because the word on opening up Lodge activities was so late in coming, I do not have any special events on the June Calendar. ## FROM THE WEST





This well-known quote from Brother Sir Winston Leonard Spencer-Churchill comes from remarks made at the Lord Mayor's Luncheon on November 10, 1942. For full context of the timing and environment when Churchill said this, it was a little over three years into the war and a year and a half after the end of the Battle of Britain. The "end of the beginning" was the first major victory for the Allies in turning back German forces at El Alamein, Egypt. Nobody knew when the end would be, but it certainly was the "end of the

beginning."

The idea of an "end of the beginning" feels so very apropos right now. In my LEO Minute at May's Stated Communication, I talked a little about some of the battles we've been through over the past 16 months. In early 2020, COVID cases rose to the tens of thousands in just weeks. By mid-March, all Lodge activities were suspended, and degree work stopped. We believed the virus couldn't survive the warmer summer months, but as we rolled into autumn case numbers hit an all-time high. One-day conferrals were on, then off, then on, then off again. Indoor gatherings were restricted to 10 or fewer people just in time for Thanksgiving and Christmas. Lodges held their officers' line in place and spent the first months of 2021 with just officers present for the dispatch of essential business. By April, we could meet in groups of 50 and complete some much anticipated degree work for some very worthy and patient Brothers.

As I type this, the limit for indoor gatherings is now 100 and 250 for outdoor gatherings. We await May 28th when the Governor is expected to further relax restrictions, with Grand Lodge anticipated to follow suit. Just like in 1942, this is not the end of the war against COVID-19. It is not even the beginning of the end. But it is-perhaps-the end of the beginning. Give a listen to Brother Winston delivering his remarks at https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=lK-rKQYB9ns.
