

FROM THE WEST



“To Everything There is a Season...”

"Turn! Turn! Turn!" is a song written by Pete Seeger in the late 1950s which, according to interviews, he says he wrote in fifteen minutes because he was mad at his publisher. The song was adapted by the American folk-rock group The Byrds and became an international hit in late 1965.

The lyrics—except for the title, which is repeated throughout the song, and the final two lines—consist of the first eight verses of the third chapter of Ecclesiastes:

3 To everything there is a season, and a time to every purpose under the heaven: ² A time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up that which is planted; ³ A time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; ⁴ A time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ⁵ A time to cast away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; ⁶ A time to get, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to cast away; ⁷ A time to rend, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; ⁸ A time to love, and a time to hate; a time of war, and a time of peace.

In Matthew Henry’s *Commentary on the Whole Bible* first published in 1706, the scope of these verses is “to show that we live in a world of changes” and we are continually passing and repassing between the events of time and our human life in the revolutions of every day and every year. In our lives there is a constant ebbing and flowing, waxing and waning, from one extreme to the other. Yet every change concerning us—as husbands, fathers, sons, and Brothers—is guided by a Supreme Power.

As we close out 2021 and look with renewed hope and excitement toward 2022, it is well we remember tomorrow will be as this day, where the lowest valleys will also join to the highest mountains. Yet in humble dependence upon Divine Providence and application of the moral lessons of Freemasonry, we may content ourselves with, and make use of, the gifts the Supreme Architect of the Universe has given us.
